How will AIMS affect me?

- There will be significant changes to the way in which Supply Chain managers work. Work will be primarily online to manage:
 - Schedule cycle and physical inventory counts, define, manage, set and update ABC analysis
 - Assess purchasing opportunities, develop a strategy, create and evaluate negotiation packages
 - Create a Purchase Order from a requisition

What do I need to know?

Supply Chain managers will learn online processes for: Sourcing and Contracts, Inventory Management and Purchasing.

Learning for Supply Chain managers may include (among other modules):

- Performing cycle and inventory counts
- Procurement management

Top 3: What's in it for me?

- Provincial consistency
- Utilize a provincial contract registry to know what has gone out for Request for Proposal (RFP) / Request for Quotation (RFQ)

How will I learn what I need to know?

- Managers of staff who work in Supply Chain Management will attend webinars to understand the changes their staff will experience, learn about their work in the system and how to support staff throughout this process.
- Managers will have specific self-directed online learning modules to complete.
- Drop-in webinars moderated by subject matter experts will be held for questions.

- Staff progress through the modules will be tracked so that Managers are aware of where staff are in the process should further support be needed.
