

## *AIMS Key Messages*

### Purpose of the AIMS Project

- The Administrative Information Management System or 'AIMS' Project is a provincial health system initiative involving the Saskatchewan Health Authority, 3sHealth, eHealth, the Saskatchewan Cancer Agency, SAHO and affiliated employers
- Currently, there are approximately 80 non-integrated systems within the province:
  - Many activities are completed manually
  - There is no real-time, comparative provincial information
  - Some older systems are becoming unstable, and costly to repair and maintain
- AIMS is an integrated business system to:
  - Better manage finance, human resource and supply chain processes
  - Integrate strategic information to inform effective decision-making
  - Standardized tools to support the development of consistent practices and processes

### Design/Development

- The AIMS Project has three phases:
  - The first phase ran from October 1, 2018 to January, 2019
    - This was a discovery period to understand the current environment and where improvements could be achieved, informed by employee and subject matter expert input
  - The second phase creates an end-to-end working prototype and implement the new system:
    - This will be achieved in cycles of building, reviewing and validating

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- This phase includes educating and training staff
- The third phase will support the new system upon implementation:
  - Supporting staff as they learn the new system and processes
  - Optimizing and improving the system and solution

## **Benefits for those who work for or interact with the health system**

- AIMS will ensure that the right resources are available at the right time and place
- AIMS will provide a consistent and positive experience for healthcare professionals, patients and families
- AIMS supports the move to a single health authority by standardizing and enhancing processes of the former health regions
